Biographical Note

Dr. Margaret (Meg) M. Mulrooney is Associate Professor of History and Associate Vice-Provost of University Studies at James Madison University in Harrisonburg, Virginia. A native of Wilmington, Delaware, she received her B.A. from the University of Delaware and her M.A. and Ph.D. in American Studies from the College of William and Mary in 1996. Much of her research and teaching focuses on local and public history, collective memory, and 19th and early 20th century United States social and cultural history, particularly race and identity. Selected publications by Mulrooney include *Black Powder, White Lace: The du Pont Irish and Cultural Identity in 19th-Century America*, *Fleeing the Famine: North America and Irish Refugees, 1845-1861*, *A Legacy of Coal: The Coal Company Towns of Southwestern Pennsylvania*, and *Norvelt and Penncraft, Pennsylvania: Subsistence Homestead Communities of the 1930s*.
